

WARNING SIGNS THAT YOU SHOULD CALL YOUR VET

- **BLEEDING:** Blood in stool or urine, or bleeding from any body part.
- **CONVULSIONS:** Violent shaking of the head or legs, dazed appearance, stiffness and inability to move.
- **EATING HABITS CHANGE:** Refusing food, eating significantly more or less.
- **WEIGHT LOSS:** Dramatic changes in weight loss over short periods of time.
- **CHANGES IN THIRST/URINATION:** Unquenchable thirst, increases in volume or frequency of urination, straining or inability to urinate, urinating in the house, change in urination habits.
- **VOMITING AND/OR DIARRHEA:** Multiple episodes in a short period, or continued episodes over a long period.
- **COUGHING:** Any coughing other than occasional single episodes.
Nasal discharge or dry, scaly nose, hacking without bringing up any hairball material.
- **PAIN:** Limping or favoring a leg, exhibiting pain when touched or lifted.
- **EYE ABNORMALITIES:** Redness, discharge, squinting, film over eye, third eyelid exposed.
- **MOUTH ABNORMALITIES:** Red gums at tooth line, tartar build-up on teeth, excessive drooling, pawing at mouth, tongue sticking out, bad breath. Check often.
- **LUMPS AND BUMPS:** Particularly those that are growing rapidly draining or bleeding. Feel entire body for these regularly.
- **SCRATCHING:** Frequently scratching or biting any body area, face or ears, shaking or tilting head or putting foot in ear to scratch.
