The dog days of summer are upon us again and the staff and volunteers at S.A.R.A. are working as hard as they can to keep things going for all of our rescued animals. With the economy in such poor shape, sales at our thrift store are at an all time low, and medical expenses are higher than ever. Because S.A.R.A.'s life-saving programs are entirely dependent on the generous donations of money, materials, and volunteer time that we receive from our great supporters, we are reaching out in hope that you will help give our rescued shelter animals the help they so desperately need and deserve.

And Now For Some News and Updates:



In 2005, when we rescued Neptune and his sister Venus from LCAS, they were 7 years young, and Neptune was unique because he had two different colored eyes. In Feb. of 2009, in accordance with our mission to never have our rescues in the shelter system again, we took the pair back into our program when their adoptive family could no longer care for them. After some TLC Neptune was back to his gregarious and affectionate self. In July of this year Neptune got an abscessed tooth and went in to the vet for a dental procedure. During this very extensive procedure with many, many extractions, Dr. Nancy Johnson noticed some swelling in his right eye and did a glaucoma test, which came back positive. Initially, everyone thought that this condition could be managed with eye drops, but when it came time for the re-check on his eye, we took him to Dr. Maxwell, the animal Ophthalmologist, and learned that the glaucoma was a secondary symptom of a bigger problem. Neptune had a melanoma in his right eye and the doctor said they eye would have to be removed. We were very upset at the news that this was an extremely painful condition, so we called up to OSU and scheduled the surgery as soon as we could. Neptune came through the procedure amazingly well and started on the path of healing. After two weeks his stitches came out and since then he has been acting like a kitten. Neptune is such an amazing soul, we could never imagine not having done this for him. S.A.R.A. is dedicated to stopping at nothing to give each dog or cat we rescue the second chance they so richly deserve, but we could not take such an active approach without the generous support of caring people like you.

I was featured in S.A.R.A.'s 2010 Summer Newsletter after S.A.R.A. rescued me from the red alert euthanasia list at LCAS (Lane County Animal Services) where I had lost a good portion of my coat to demadex mites. The staff and volunteers worked hard to help me, but the real change came when I was seen by Dr. Ashley, and the all caring staff at the Veterinary Allergy & Dermatology Services. Everyone there got to know me very well through many visits working to figure out what was wrong with me and how to go about fixing it. I was finally able to breath a big sigh of relief on July 25th when I got my *first clean skin scraping* to go along with the beautiful, shiny, full coat of hair I had grown! The doctor says I have to continue on some of my medications and supplements for environmental allergens (maybe for the rest of my life!), but I am alright with that because I never want to feel like I did before! I also had an amazingly fun, full out doggie good time learning many new things at "Good Dog" training classes with Jennifer Biglan! I even got a graduating "Certificate of Training"! My favorite part of the class was the homework, because my foster family took me to all sorts of fun places to work on my training in different environments! But... the best news of all is that *I have found my forever family!* My foster mom and dad say they feel that my "special needs" might be too much of a challenge for average people, but I know that the real reason is that they have really fallen in love with me! Which is GREAT cause I sure do love them! Without supporters like YOU great dogs like ME that just need a little extra time and special care would not be saved! 
Feb. 2011 Dozen Dumped Cats Update:

S.A.R.A.'s last newsletter featured a group of 12 kitties that were abandoned in the middle of the night at S.A.R.A.'s front door. Your kind support made it possible for S.A.R.A. to give each of these abandoned kitties the top-notch medical care they so desperately needed. We are thrilled to report that 9 of these special felines have been adopted to loving, forever homes, and are thriving! 3 of them, Hazelnut, Snorkel, and Coconut, are still in our care. While Hazelnut is actively looking for her forever home at S.A.R.A.'s Treasures, Coconut and Snorkel are still requiring medical treatment. They came to us sicker than anyone else in the bunch, with very severe



upper respiratory infections, and while they have shown much improvement with the medications, supplements, and quality food they have been given, they still have a way to go before being healthy enough for S.A.R.A to place them up for adoption. These amazing girls are perfect examples of cats who would be killed in the shelter system, it would be too much work, and extra time, taking up space, for them to be patient and let them heal. We are confident with time, love, patience, (and a little more medication) that Coconut and Snorkel will make a full recovery and have tons of love and snuggles to share with a family in their own forever home.
