It's been a busy winter and spring for S.A.R.A. The Cat Rescue team has been caring for our many rescued cats & kittens, getting them spayed/neutered, vaccinated, socialized, micro-chipped, etc. and then adopting them out to carefully screened, loving homes. The Dog Rescue team has been rescuing, finding foster homes for, and training the special needs dogs who have been saved from our local shelters, with the gracious assistance of Jennifer Biglan of Dog & Cat training and behavior consultations (www.dogandcat.org) and the Waggin Inn Boarding Kennel.

Melinda, our S.A.R.A.'s Treasures Manager, and her husband Roy, our volunteer webmaster, came up with a great way to bring new customers into our shop so we can raise more money to help more shelter animals - the Queen Delilah Geocache! Geocaching is like a treasure hunt - people search for our cache, using their GPS (Global Positioning System) unit, finding our treasure from geographic coordinates posted on the internet. When they find the cache, they sign our log and can take a trinket if they are sure to leave something new for the next treasure hunter. 
The lady suddenly died, and LCARA was called in to pick us up. They brought 7 of us to their facility to start with, and after a week none of us had yet been adopted.

The S.A.R.A cat ladies came to visit us, and found out that since the LCARA field staff planned to bring in another 7 of our family that day, the kennel staff were going to kill those of us who were already there "to make room"!

Melinda & Nicole were shocked, and went directly to the LCARA Manager. He was unaware of his staff's plan to kill us, and agreed that if S.A.R.A. would rescue all 7 of us *that day*, LCARA would pay for our spays. So that's how we got saved, all in one fell swoop. Besides Suzi and I, Calvin, Hobbs, Peanut, Strawberry and Beau were also rescued that day. The next week they went back and rescued our parents - Howie and Nubbin.

We were infested with fleas, ear mites and tape worms, but the S.A.R.A. Cat Ladies got us all fixed up, and now everyone has been adopted except us two. I'm a wonderful kitty, who wants to be in a home with another cat, because I love them, whereas Suzi doesn't care whether or not she had a kitty friend, but she seems to think dogs are very cool....?!
